## Operation BRAVO Announces Overseas Voting Pilot Project

*November 26, 2007 – Washington, D.C.* – The Operation BRAVO (Bring Remote Access to Voters Overseas) Foundation has scheduled a press conference for Wednesday, December 5 at 10 a.m. at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C.

The Foundation will announce its partnership with the Supervisor of Elections of Okaloosa County, Florida and the SAIT (The Security and Assurance in Information Technology) Laboratory at Florida State University to conduct the Okaloosa Distance Balloting Project (ODBP). The ODBP is an experiment designed to make absentee voting more reliable for overseas civilian and military voters. The experiment will include the placement of secure voting kiosks in three overseas locations for the November 4, 2008 general election.
